Spot 1: Cheorwon First Church

- Construction began in 1936 and built in 1937, the number of believers at the time reached 500. It is also the home of the independence movement that first sparked protests in Gangwon-do. In 1942, Senior Pastor Kang Jong-geun was arrested by the Japanese police under the Preliminary Prosecution Order of the Thought Act for refusing to visit the shrine by the Japanese imperialists.
- Afterwards, during the Korean War, the anti-communist struggle of young Christian students centered around the Cheorwon Methodist Church under communism took place. During the war, under the North Korean regime, it was used as a barracks



and wards for the People's Army, and the church basement was also used as a place of atrocities where civilians and anti-communist fighters were tortured. It was in ruins during the war and is now destroyed without recognizing its shape.

Spot2: Cheorwon Labor Party Building



This building was built under the North Korean regime in early 1946 as the Labor Party of North Korea.

This building was notorious for being the headquarters of the North Korean Workers' Party of Korea Cheorwon County, which was built by North Korea after liberation on August 15, 1945 for the purpose of strengthening the communist dictatorship and controlling residents and used before the Korean War.

During the five years of communism, North Korea oversaw the Cheorwon, Gimhwa, Pyonggang, and Pocheon areas here and

committed countless atrocities, including extortion of civilians and the arrest, torture, and massacre of patriots. It is also the site of a ruthless slaughter that would have turned into a return site. In the air defense shelter behind this building, many human bones and numerous live ammunition and wire wires used in the atrocities were found.

Spot 3: Church in Military base at Cheorwon Area

Spot 4: DMZ and Panmunjum

Panmunjom is 60 km north of Seoul and 10 km east of Gaeseong (in North Korea). This is the Joint Security Area (JSA) that straddles the Military Demarcation Line (MDL) on the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) near Paju.
